- Cut back overhanging trees or bushes.

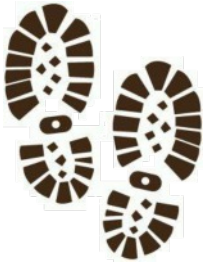

On the first Saturday of each month the church is open from 10am to 12noon for

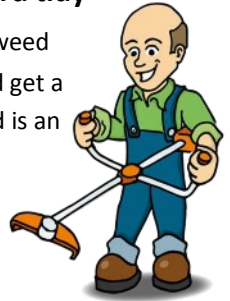


tea and coffee.

Rector's Letter February 2018



With the arrival of the month of February the evenings are gradually getting lighter and signs of spring are beginning to appear. The first spring flowers are bursting into life and the trees and shrubs are beginning to stir out of their winter slumber.

As a keen gardener I am looking forward to the prospect of getting out into the garden once again and I have already been sorting through my seed packets to see what I can set first.

February also sees the beginning of Lent, a season which begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year is on 14th February, Valentine's Day. The season of Lent, a period of 40 days (46 if you include Sundays) reminds us of the time Jesus spent in the wilderness before his ministry began.

Many traditions have grown up around Lent from the giving up chocolate, to learning a Bible verse each day, to reading a Lent book. All have their own advantages and help prepare us for Easter Day and I'm pleased to say that this year there will be a Benefice Lent Course run.

Beginning on **Thursday 22nd February at Eton Church** the course will be held each Thursday between 11.30am -1.30pm ending on 22nd March. Everyone is welcome. Drinks will be provided, but please bring a packed lunch with you. More details about the content of the course are available from Jackie but come prepared to listen, pray, reflect, discuss and, if you want to, get creative. There will also be an opportunity to spend some of the time in silence or reading.

To begin Lent there will be a service of Holy Communion on **14th February at Eton Church at 7.30pm**. During the service we will receive the sign of the cross, in ash prepared from last year's palm crosses, on our fore heads with the words "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ" This reminds us of our own mortality and our need of repentance, saying sorry for the things we have done wrong, and asking for God's forgiveness.

Lent gives us the opportunity to grow closer to God, and so be ready to meet the risen Lord on Easter Day, which this year is on 1st April, April Fools Day. It is lovely to think that by the time Easter comes our gardens will be bursting with new life, reminding us of the new life that God offers to us through His Son Jesus Christ.

However you prepare for Easter I pray you will have a very holy and peaceful Lent.

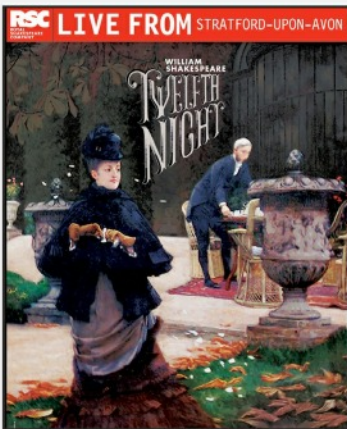

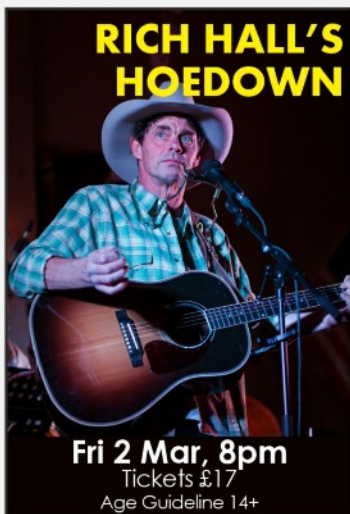

Community Speed Watch 2018 – Parish Volunteers sought

Community Speed Watch is a scheme to allow volunteers to monitor the speed of passing vehicles using a hand-held speed detection device.

The volunteers record the details of vehicles which are exceeding the speed limit by around 10%. These details are passed to the Police, who will issue a letter to the vehicle owner, advising them of the dangers of speeding, and reminding them of the law. If three letters are issued to the same vehicle owner, the Police carry out further investigation.

Residents in Ecton are worried about speeding vehicle so the Parish Council has joined the Community Speed watch 2018 programme to tackle this danger.

We need volunteers who will be properly trained to use the calibrated speed gun, just like the police use. We can't (and don't want to) fine motorists we find speeding but they will get a warning letter from the police as a reminder.

We will also get signs reminding people to slow down and interactive devices that will display the speed of a vehicle for drivers to see. All designed to educate and make drivers aware of speeding in our community.

And evidence collected from Speed Watch can be used by the Parish Council in any discussions with the County Council over possible traffic calming methods.

We need your help

We need at least 6 adult volunteers to help with Ecton Community Speed Watch before we can continue with the programme so we are asking for your help.

Training will take place on Saturday 2nd June 2018 from 09.30 hours to 12.15 hours at Caroline Chisolm School. (However other training dates are available if you are unable to attend this session)

Ecton will receive the speed device and monitor equipment on 9th June 2018.

Please contact the Parish Clerk if you would like to become a volunteer.

Community Defibrillator – Should the Parish Council purchase a Community Defibrillator?

Ecton Parish Council are considering purchasing an external community defibrillator which would be installed at a convenient point in the village. It would be available for anyone to use should the need arise to save a life (Though we hope this never happens).

It would be housed in a secure cabinet which requires a 4 digit code to be entered on the keypad to gain access to the unit.

The code will be given by the emergency operator when you **Dial 999**.

When you open the front access panel on the defibrillator you will receive verbal instructions on how to use the device.

We would like to hear your thoughts if you think the Parish Council should purchase such a unit?

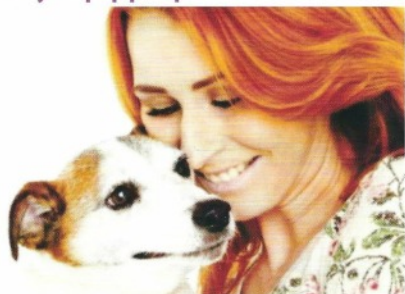

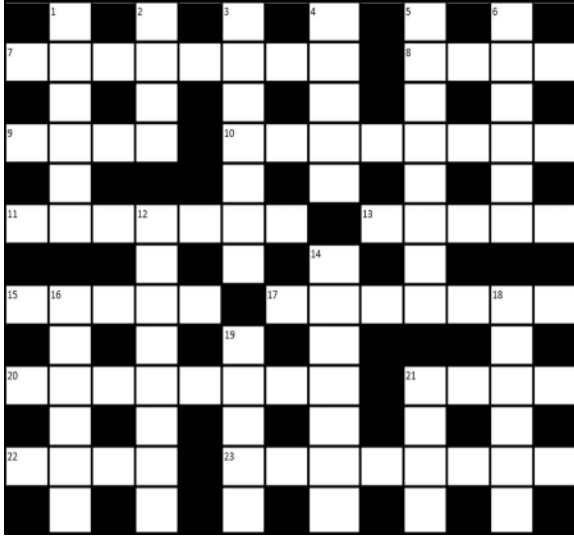

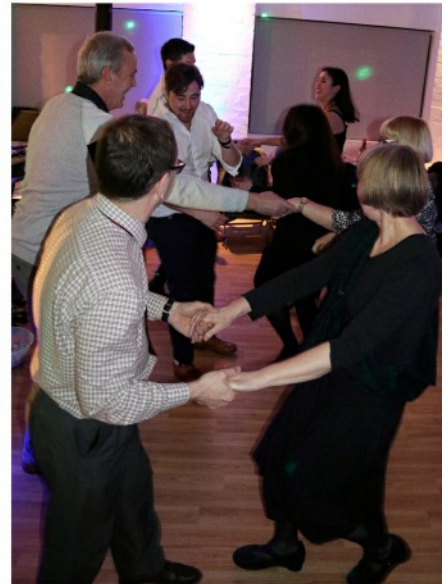

10 January 2018 - Police relaunch free message alert system to help keep communities safe – sign up today!

Northamptonshire Police has relaunched a free message alert system, to help people living and working in Northamptonshire be much better informed about crime and police activity in their local area, and help keep their communities safe.

The messaging service, called Northamptonshire Neighbourhood Alert (formerly known as Community Connect), now has greater functionality than previously, allowing frontline police officers to send alert messages direct from their mobile devices to thousands of local people. They will be able to do this in real-time while they are out and about policing the county.

The alert service is free and simple to activate by registering at www.northamptonshireneighbourhoodalert.co.uk and is available to anyone living or working in Northamptonshire.

After signing up to the messaging system, people will receive regular alerts from Northamptonshire Police, Neighbourhood Watch and other partner organisations, keeping them up to date and informed about crime and issues relevant to them and the area where they live or work.

Alerts are received either by email, text message or voice message – whichever suits. People will also be given the option of what they want to receive alerts about, and how often – you will only receive messages about topics that you have selected.

Chief Inspector Lara Alexander-Lloyd said: "Our communities play a crucial part in helping us prevent and detect crime and anti-social behaviour. Police officers and PCSOs will be regularly sending out message alerts via Northamptonshire Neighbourhood Alert, appealing for help, highlighting suspicious activity, offering crime prevention advice, and keeping people up to date about general police work and safety events.

"This re-launched community messaging tool means we can now do this in real time, with officers sending out alerts via mobile devices while they are still out on patrol. This allows information to be shared really quickly and much more directly with the public about crime and activity in their specific locality, helping us to involve and protect the community much more.

"If for example, there has been a spate of distraction burglaries in a particular district or an increase in vehicle crime, we can tell people immediately. So they can better protect themselves and be more alert to any potential threats and risks. We can also very quickly share descriptions of suspects or appeal for witnesses – giving us a greater chance of arrest.

"We already have more than 10,000 people signed up to the alert system and we want many, many more to register and receive information from Northamptonshire Police and our partners. By working together, we can make Northamptonshire a safer place to live and work and help to protect people from harm."

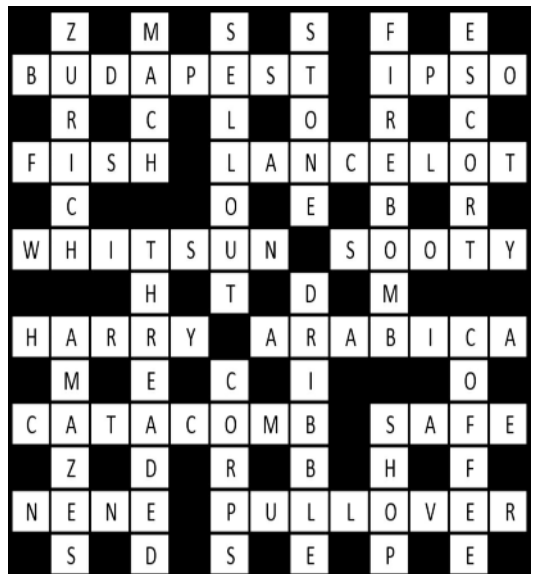
