Editors Notes

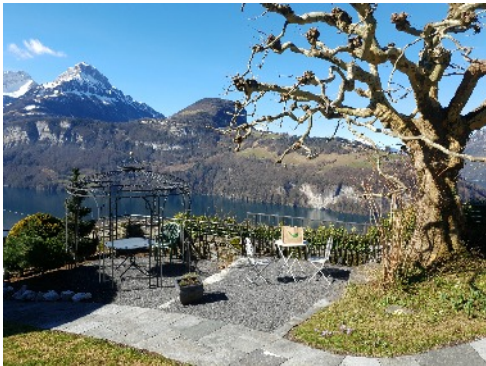

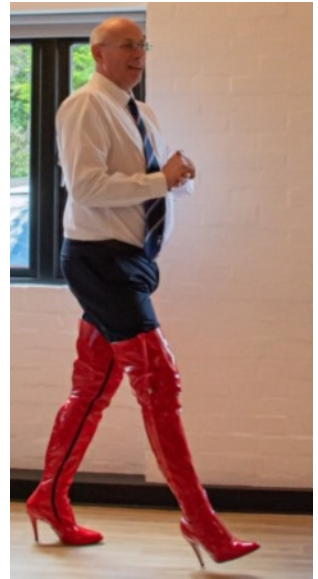

On 3rd July the church remembers St. Thomas, one of Jesus' disciples. Thomas is most often referred to as doubting Thomas, a title he earned through not being present at Jesus' resurrection appearance in the Upper Room. Having not seen with his own eyes, he doubted that Jesus had risen from the dead. But doubt is not the only thing Thomas should be remembered for, because he was in fact one of the boldest among the disciples, daring to ask the difficult questions and stating his beliefs, as well as his doubts, with confidence.

Doubt can be a strong, often lonely feeling, especially when others around us appear to firmly believe and trust in the very thing we are having doubts about, but doubt can in time bring us and others to a firmer foundation, as the Collect for St. Thomas reminds us:

*Almighty and eternal God,
who, for the firmer foundation of our faith,
allowed your holy apostle Thomas
to doubt the resurrection of your Son
till word and sight convinced him...*

In our country, and in our world today there is much uncertainty and doubt about the future. And through the experiences of loss, illness or accident, our lives can be shaken to the core. When that happens Christians can take comfort in knowing that God understands our doubts and fears. He was gentle with Thomas, appearing a week later to prove to him and to all Christians, that we can believe and trust in him.

And so when we remember Thomas, let us remember not only that he doubted but that he trod the paths of both faith and doubt and found God to be his companion on both.

Church Roof Update

Following the PCC meeting in May we have now instructed the architect and builder to begin the work on the church roof. Work will begin on 16 September 2019.

As many of you will be aware, part of the church roof is leaking and needs to be replaced. The lead over the chancel (the altar and choir section of the church) has been repaired many times over the years but is now at the end of its life. The new covering will be terne coated steel, which looks very much like lead, but is much less appealing to thieves. We have recently been granted a faculty (church planning permission) for the works.

The full cost of the work, including VAT, will be just over £37,000.

Following the amazing generosity of villagers both in giving money and organising/supporting fund raising events, we have £19,400 towards this cost. We hope to be able to claim back the VAT (providing there are sufficient funds in a government pot designated for this purpose). The outstanding balance is approximately £11,500.

The church is currently applying to a number of trusts for grants which we hope will cover a large part of this deficit. Funding raising events will continue (e.g. Summer Fete on 6 July!) and of course we continue to gratefully accept donations. We are restricted to when we can carry out the work due to the presence of bats. The two windows of opportunity are April and September and so, confident that we will have the money required by October, the PCC has decided to go ahead with the September start date. Thank you once again for all the support that is given to the church. - Joy Bond, Church Warden

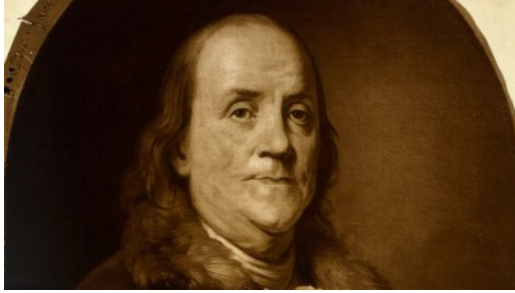

US founding father records could return to Northamptonshire



Following a recent visit to Ecton by BBC Radio Northampton, there has been renewed interest in our village's rich history:

BBC News Northampton - Article - 12th June 2019

- Papers revealing the family links of a Founding Father of the United States to a village church in Northamptonshire could be returned after 250 years.

It was thought Benjamin Franklin took the records from Ecton, the birthplace of his father, in the 1750s.

Massachusetts Historical Society's Peter Drummey said they first went to London and then the US in the 1800s. He said they would "appropriately address" the return of the records which date from 1646. Mr Drummey, whose society currently holds the records, said that Franklin was "very interested" in his family links to Ecton and in the summer of 1758 he made a trip to the village to meet his extended family.

He said from reading letters Franklin sent to his wife, he "seemed to take pride" in his roots and the "connection was very real".

It was believed that during the trip Franklin took that tithe records from St Mary Magdalene church. Tithe records contained details about landowners and tenants and the taxes they paid to support the local church.

Mr Drummey said they were "not sure" how the records left the church, but they showed up in London in the 1800s.

He said an engineer called Wake bought them from an antiquarian dealer in 1850 and sent them to the US thinking the Franklin connection would spark interest.

"It would be impossible to trace how they ended up in the US," he added.

"I don't think you can assign any blame to Benjamin Franklin for them leaving Ecton."

Currently, St Mary Magdalene has a copy of the front cover.

Mr Drummey said they would now "explore" either returning the records or providing a full copy.

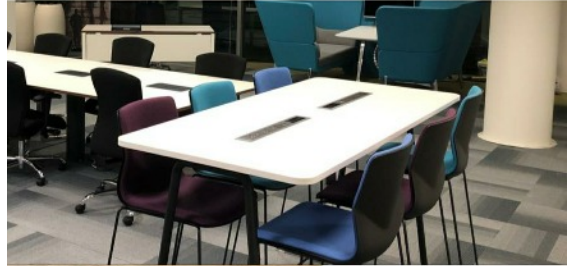
Sally Bresnahan, chairwoman of Ecton Parish Council, hoped the records would help track down the "Franklin House" in the village.

The house is referred to in Franklin's letters, but Ms Bresnahan said they were "not absolutely sure" where the house was, but the records should show what property or properties the Franklins owned.

In this issue of The Ecton View I would like to politely raise the matter of inconsiderate, dangerous and often illegal parking in Ecton in contravention of The Highway Code Sections 239-243. This especially applies to the Church Way/High St., and the Northampton Rd./A4500 junctions.

Below are some highlights from the sections mentioned above, for full details please refer to the Highway Code, all details can be found online at www.highwaycodeuk.co.uk/parking.

The Highway Code - Section 242

You **MUST NOT** leave your vehicle or trailer in a dangerous position or where it causes any unnecessary obstruction of the road.

The Highway Code - Section 243

DO NOT stop or park

- near a school entrance
- anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- in front of an entrance to a property
- on a bend
- where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities **except** when forced to do so by stationary traffic.

The Highway Code - Section 244

You **MUST NOT** park partially or wholly on the pavement in London, and should not do so elsewhere unless signs permit it. Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs. *Law GL(GP)A sect 15*

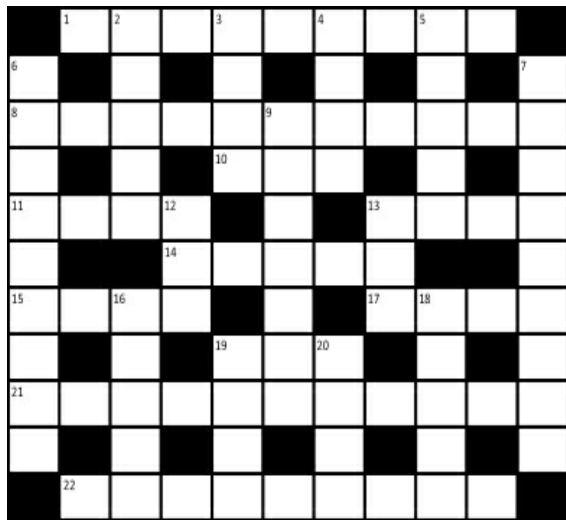

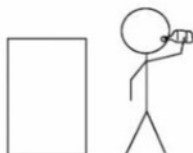

Taking just a few steps can make a big difference in keeping your home safe from burglary. Here are a few tips:

1. Lock your doors and windows every time you leave the house, even when you're just out in the garden, remembering to double-lock UPVC doors (lift handle and turn key).
2. Hide all keys, including car keys, out of sight and away from the letterbox (remember a device could be used to hook keys through the letterbox).
3. Install a visual burglar alarm (as part of a suite of prevention measures - a burglar alarm on its own will not prevent entry to your home).
4. Install good outside lighting.
5. Get a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property.
6. Leave radios or lights in your house on a timer to make the property appear occupied.
7. Make sure the fences around your garden are in good condition.
8. Secure bikes at home by locking them to an immovable object inside a locked shed or garage.
9. Keep ladders and tools stored away; don't leave them outside where they could be used to break into your home.
10. Ensure side gates are locked to prevent access to the rear of the property.
11. Ensure rear fencing is in good repair.
12. Improve natural surveillance at the front of your property i.e. trim high hedges.
13. Mark your property with postcode and house number and register your property for free with Immobilise at <http://www.immobilise.com/>
