Ecton Walks in Lockdown - 2020



A big thankyou to Wendy for putting a footpath map on the cover of last month's magazine. You will find all these paths on it! A couple more suggestions for walks:

Ecton Brook and Rectory Farm Pocket Parks – 3-ish miles (Circular)

At the bottom of West Street turn right and follow the path across the fields to Ecton Brook.

Turn right as you get to the lake and continue up through the park, under the A4500 and into Rectory Farm pocket park.

Just follow your nose and keep all the houses on the left.

You emerge at the edge of a newish housing estate, turn right across the footbridge and right onto the track.

At the top of the hill bear right on the byway and you eventually meet the surfaced part of Cutthroat Lane.

Before you get to Sywell Lane you can cut the corner across the field to the right and head for the water tower.

Look out for Herons by the small lakes.

A Longer Walk 7 miles (Lollipop)

Down through the village and along the tracks to Cogenhoe Mill caravan park. (Look out for the goslings on the river).

Follow the road up towards Cogenhoe but turn left just on the right hand bend and turn right onto the footpath.

Almost immediately left and down through big fields eventually meeting the Cogenhoe Grendon Road.

Follow the road towards Grendon for a few hundred metres and then cut right through a field to Whiston.

Follow the road up the hill and turn right onto a track leading off from the left hand bend. This winds along to a ford and soon after that you will see a path to the right heading up towards the trees.

Up the hill, through the trees (an old quarry) and up a string of steps emerging into a cornfield.

Look out for Buzzards and Red Kites.

Turn right and follow the edge of the field. Go through a gap at the end and immediately turn right down a set of steps (Jacob's Ladder) – bear slightly left and then follow the right hand side of the field down to the road.

Straight across and up the hill and you have completed the circle of the lollipop.

Retrace your steps to Ecton.

Or just have a stroll round the village and through the local fields. If you walk through the churchyard please leave the gates open. If you would like more ideas for local walks feel free to email me on nigelbond@talktalk.net.

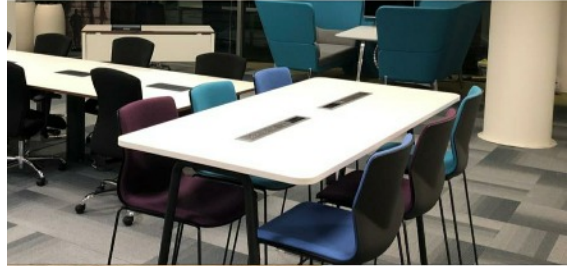
The **dates for June are the 10th and 24th**. The intention is to do something and be part of something, together, as a community.

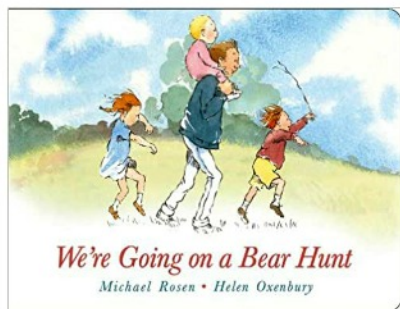

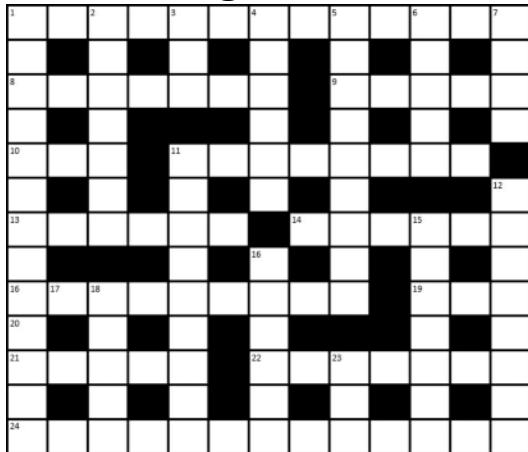
Banish the boredom with a lockdown bucket list.

COMMUNITY JUSTICE SECURITY

Northamptonshire Police Supports Online Day of Action To Raise Awareness of Raptor Persecution

OPERATION OWL

Be our eyes and ears



Worrying signs that incidents of birds of prey being killed or injured could be on rise. Northamptonshire Police is joining with other police forces across the country today (Friday, May 15), in a virtual Operation Owl day of action to highlight bird of prey persecution as numbers of reported incidents show no signs of slowing down.

Launched in February 2018, Operation Owl is a joint initiative by North Yorkshire Police, the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB) and the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (RSPCA), together with the North York Moors and Yorkshire Dales National Parks and the Nidderdale AONB.

The initiative set out to raise awareness of raptor persecution, encouraging the public to be vigilant for signs of this criminal activity, and to report suspicious activity to the police.

In June last year, Operation Owl was rolled out nationally and the first awareness weekend was held in September 2019 with 26 police forces taking part across the whole of the UK.

“The three vital pieces of information we want to make everyone aware of are Recognise, Record and Report – how to recognise bird of prey persecution, how to record it and how to report it.

“If you notice anything suspicious, like a dead or injured bird of prey, or a suspicious trap, call the police on 101. Take pictures on your phone, and remember please do not interfere with what could be a crime scene or a lawfully placed trap.

“Please share our messages with your networks online and please be vigilant for signs of raptor persecution when you are out and about taking your daily exercise. Everyone has a part to play in helping put an end to this relentless persecution.”
