# THEM THAR HILLS

Firstly may I thank all of the people that we have met so far in the village for the warm welcome that you have given both Trish and I. Whilst we have only been here four months we really have begun to feel at home.

Those of you that have got to know us will be aware that we have moved here from North East Derbyshire and whilst there may not be gold in them thar hills there certainly is a treasure trove of wonderful countryside, which as a Sheffield lad I have spent many years walking and latterly converted a London city girl to the fun of walking in its beautiful and rugged landscape.

Our jaunts over the last three or four years have been curtailed as Anno Domini caught up on my hips and I had to be transformed into bionic man with two new Titanium replacements. I can now vouch for the sense in ridding myself of the acute arthritic pain as I managed to walk the twelve miles of Win Hill in the Hope Valley, which was our favourite walk, just before we moved down to Northampton.

Having talked about this at one of the “festive doos” a good number of people expressed an interest in a walking weekend in the Peak District in the springtime which I volunteered to organise. Up early Saturday morning, an hour and a half’s drive to Derbyshire followed by a 5/6 mile walk on reasonably flat but rough terrain which might take in an Iron Age Fort where daubing up with wode is optional. An overnight stay in “Country Inn” accommodation followed by another slightly less strenuous walk on Sunday morning, lunch and then home. This is not “mountaineering” but a moderately demanding stroll and well within the compass of anyone who walks and is reasonably fit. The pace of the walks will be tailored to meet the demands of the party, is intended to be fun and not a trial of strength and endurance.

The local underfoot conditions are either millstone grit (Dark Peak) or Limestone (White Peak) and will be muddy in the spring I suspect, so good strong walking boots are essential as are waterproofs and clothing layers to accommodate the changeable weather conditions. For those who wish to replenish their kit there are lots of excellent walking/climbing gear shops particularly in Hathersage village at the entrance to the Hope Valley.

Anyone who is interested please contact me on 01604 400157 and I will dig out my maps and books and we can have a planning meeting in the pub, firm up on routes, numbers etc and I can also get information together on accommodation.

Those of you who expressed an interest but were fortified by Christmas Spirit and are now reading this in horror- I know who you are!

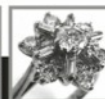

## *From the Vicarage,*



So much seems to have happened since I last wrote for ‘Ecton View’ – that was back in mid-November. Then we were reflecting upon Remembrance, but since then we have completed Advent, Christmas, and New Year. I wonder how it all was for you. We managed to keep well at the Vicarage, but I know that many in our area have suffered a lot of ‘bugs’ – some have had various strains of flu, while for others it has been tummy bugs. I do hope Christmas was not spoiled for you and that you are now enjoying returning to a more normal pattern of life.

Thinking back to Remembrance for a moment, I am reminded yet again that we still live in a very violent world. As I write this time the overthrow of the government in Tunisia has recently taken place with the president having fled the country and martial law having been put in place. We all regret the deaths that have been caused, especially as there appear to be so many, and mainly from the brutality of the police, if reports are to be believed; but even one is a tragedy – someone’s father, son, brother, mother, daughter, sister, or close friend. We mustn’t be complacent though. We can’t say, ‘Oh that’s a long way away, it doesn’t affect us’. We can’t be complacent because we must also ask ourselves about the protests and riots concerning student tuition fees in several of our own cities already this year. Is that so very different from what is going on in Tunisia? Certainly it is far less extreme, but in essence is it not similar?

We are also at present praying for those affected by flooding around the world, and it seems to be ever more widespread – Australia, Sri Lanka, and now Brazil too. At the same time, though, there are those places in the world that are regularly hit by these kinds of monsoon conditions and who annually live with deaths by mudslide or drowning, and the sweeping away of homes and infrastructure – like Nepal, for example. It’s sad that that country doesn’t hit the international news in the same way.

Coming back home we have a big project that has just begun across all three of our churches. 2011 marks the four hundredth anniversary of the translating of the King James Bible. ‘So what!’ you might say, but it is a very significant milestone for although there were earlier translations this was the first official one and the first to be read publicly in Church services. We are celebrating, not specifically the King James translation, which is not easy to read now as our language has changed so much over the centuries, but we are celebrating the fact that we have the scriptures in our own language – and in a rich variety of versions as well. The ‘E100 Bible Reading Challenge’ I wrote about last time. It is a programme of 100 key Bible passages designed to help us to get to grips with not only bits of the Bible, but also an appreciation of how it is all strung together and some of the major themes that can be traced through from beginning to end. Each week until mid-July the Sunday sermon introduces the coming week’s readings. So far there is much enthusiasm for this and about fifty members across the three churches have bought the little study guide for themselves. I pray that there will be a rich blessing from all this.

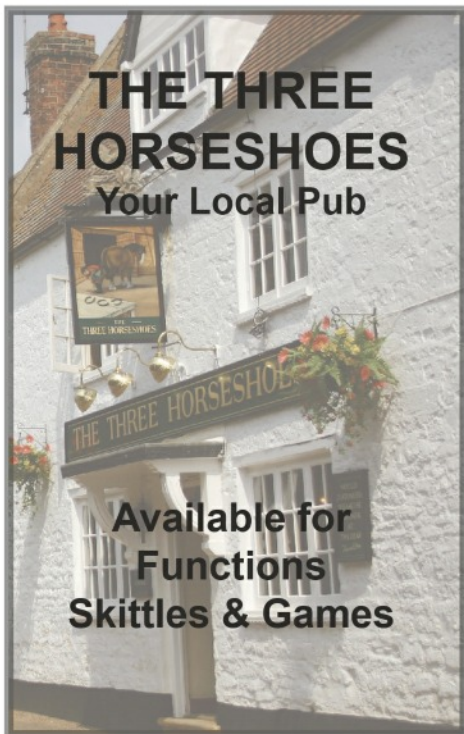

# THE ECTON BIG BREAKFAST



## Anti-social behaviour – Our priority, for **your** peace of mind

People from all walks of life commit anti-social behaviour (ASB). Graffiti, noise nuisance, littering, rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour... they're all enough to make people feel angry and frustrated, even unsafe and insecure.

To drive down ASB in our neighbourhoods, Northamptonshire's Community Safety Partnerships (CSPs), working with its partner agencies\*, decided to make ASB a priority across the county. The aim was to actively target offenders and hotspot areas, whilst ensuring victims of ASB feel satisfied with the service they receive. Our results are now speaking for themselves.

Victim satisfaction is currently rated at 83.3%\*\*\*, and exceeds local targets. Ease of contact, how a victim is treated and kept informed, and overall satisfaction are also monitored. This also means the confidence our local communities have in the services we provide and the way we're tackling ASB, crime and disorder is also at an all time high, making us one of the fastest growing counties in the country in terms of confidence levels.

Northamptonshire Police's lead on ASB, Chief Inspector Nick Purdie, explains: "This priority is a key part of our drive to putting communities first. We are aware ASB can have a dramatic effect on the quality of life of people in the county and are determined to continue to do all we can to reduce the number of incidents."

Since March 2009, criminal damage, the measure used by the police to monitor ASB, has also moved in the right direction, falling by nearly 20%\*\*\* across the county. This means 2,671 fewer offences, and is something that can be seen, (or, in this case, not!) by all members of the community. The figures for Wellingborough are also reducing, with a reduction in criminal damage offences of 13.1% - that's 232 fewer crimes!

Results don't happen overnight though, and are down to the hard work of CSPs, partners and our local communities.

In partnership with the Northamptonshire Probation Trust we have been capitalising on the efforts of the Community Payback Schemes where offenders, wearing high-vis jackets, are being held to account for their offences. Projects are being undertaken on a weekly basis, with work involving the clearing of public areas, removing graffiti, and litter picking. Supported by Wellingborough Borough Council and Wellingborough Partnership, the scheme was also heavily involved in the town's first Town Centre Clean Up, where local residents and council employees took to the streets for a grand clear up, all helping to put something positive back in to the local community.

Using funding from the CSP, outreach sessions and diversionary activities are also being provided by local youth work groups, Service Six and Groundwork. More young people than ever are being supported across the borough, with the sessions aimed at helping them through the trials they face on a daily basis, as well as diverting them away from possible criminal and anti-social activity.

Moving forward we will ensure ASB continues to be a priority across the county and in your local area. Together and in partnership, ASB is **our** priority, for **your** peace of mind.

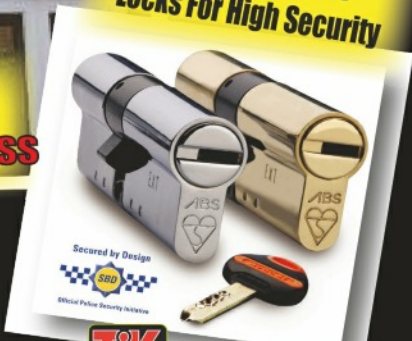

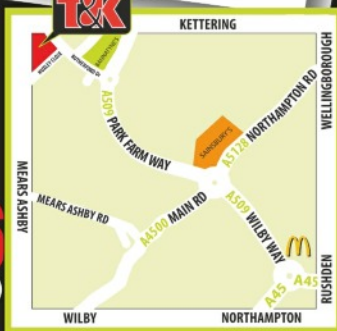
