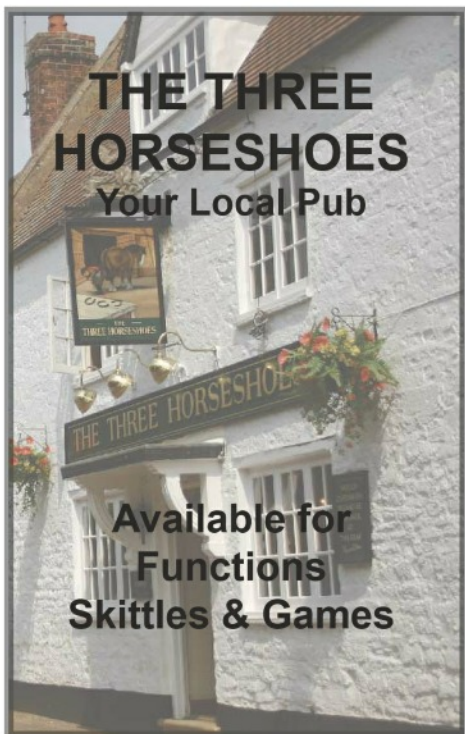

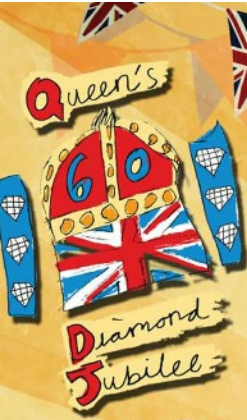

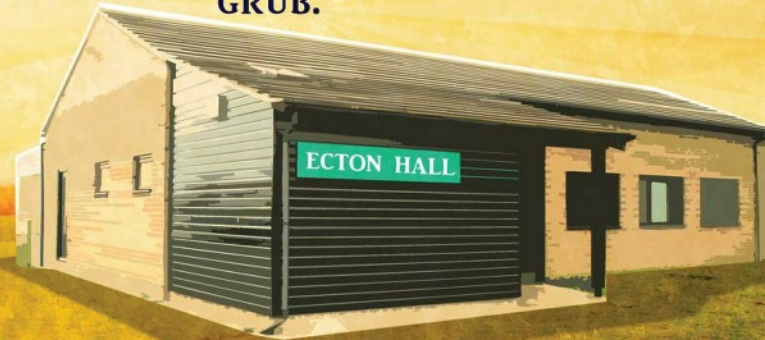

Borough Councillor's Missive



The Diary.

The new Council for 2012/ 2013 is underway, led by the new Mayor Ken (Lord) Harrington. At the inauguration ceremony this month one of the proposers for Ken mentioned that he, for reasons best known to himself, had used the title Lord Harrington as his e-mail name. I am sure he did it out of all innocence but we ask do we have to call him Lord Mayor Ken? I obviously jest a little! As this is the start of the new Council year there are a significant number of changes on the committees, often done to “freshen” things up. I have been given a small promotion to become Vice Chairman of Audit and Performance but will continue to sit on the following Committees: Development, NCC/NHS Scrutiny, West Northants Joint Strategic Planning Committee. I will also continue to chair the Billing Waste Treatment Plant Liaison Group and when it is re-born the Sywell Aerodrome JCC.

Planning

In our area three applications are creating some interest, in Mears Ashby one is for a small development on the land adjacent to Beckworths on the Wellingborough Rd, the second is for a mobile home storage area on the site currently called Mears Ashby Nurseries also on the Wellingborough Rd. The third site under consideration is the Laurels in Ecton where I understand planning permission is required to extend the mobile home site.

Billing Sewage Treatment Plant Liaison Working Group

The group met in late April and the full Minutes are available on my web site. The complaints are now being faithfully logged and for the three month period Feb to April, there were a total of 21. Each of these complaints, are being or have been investigated and a schedule of the cause and effect will be analysed at the July meeting. AWA will then take the necessary action to try to eradicate any repetition caused by the same fault.

Sywell Aerodrome Working Group

The working group is now in the process of producing its first draft report. Noticeably the company now agrees that the heading/orientation of the 03/21 runway is different to the original unfortunately they also admit that they knew at the time of the Public Inquiry that was the case. However perhaps more importantly the company recently amended the Flight Protocol to acknowledge the fact that aircraft are flying over the school and at low level on departure and arrival. In my view the protocol does not go far enough but the details can be reviewed on the SAL web site.

Sywell Country Park

I received a note from a constituent last month about car parking charges and received the following statement from NCC. “We do offer the option for people purchasing a parking season ticket to add an additional car registration number for an additional £5 on the price of a season ticket provided that the second car is registered to the same household. Our current prices for season tickets are £34 for a one named park ticket and £47 for an all parks ticket covering Sywell, Irchester, Brixworth, Barnwell and Fermyn Woods Country Parks. A season ticket provides unlimited parking in the named parks for 12 months.” I hope this helps those who had some misgivings on car park charges.

Have fun and stay safe

It's set to be a busy – and hopefully sunny – summer, bringing lots of opportunity for celebrations and parties, with the Queen's Diamond Jubilee; Euro 2012 football tournament; the Olympic Torch Relay, which comes through our county on 2 July; the London Olympics and Paralympics, and no doubt a number of local events too.

We want you to have fun and stay safe during these celebrations and, as part of a major countywide operation, officers will be out and about throughout the summer taking positive action to tackle violent crime and disorder and anti-social behaviour to help make our communities safer.

Whether it's getting into a fight outside a pub, abusing a partner at home, or being involved in a scuffle outside the school gates, getting involved in violent crime can have serious consequences.

Our ongoing enforcement activity aims to show offenders that violence will not be tolerated, and a supporting communications campaign will encourage people to think about the consequences of violence before they act, as well as provide information and advice about how to stay safe and reduce the risk of becoming a victim of crime.

Reducing the risk of harm to our communities is a key priority for the Force and a variety of tactics are being employed by officers to tackle violent crime and disorder. These include early intervention to prevent a situation from escalating, targeting prolific offenders of violent crime, providing support and advice to victims and potential victims, and taking an educational approach by involving schools and young people.

As part of the operation, 'high impact days' dedicated to reducing incidents of violence will take place across the county over coming months. During these days, officers will be carrying out warrants and arresting wanted offenders, visiting offenders on bail for violence offences to ensure they are complying with their conditions, as well as calling on people known for getting involved in violence on Friday and Saturday evenings to remind them that drunken, anti-social or violent behaviour is not welcome in our town centres.

We want people to be able to have a safe and enjoyable summer and if you're out and about, here's some simple advice for you and your family to help you stay safe:

- Don't draw attention to your valuables...keep them out of sight
- Stay in well lit busy areas, stick to main routes and don't be tempted to use shortcuts
- Having a night out? Be a good friend and stay together – plan your journey home and always use licensed taxis
- Let someone know where you are going, how they can contact you and when you are likely to be back
- If you've been a victim of any offence, please tell us – if we don't know, we can't help. Call us on 101 or in an emergency call 999

Police and Crime Commissioners (PCC)

Very soon there will be a significant change to the way policing services are managed in England and Wales. On November the 15th elections will be held to elect a PCC for each policing area with the exception of the Met (that position already rests with the Mayor.)

The PCC will replace the current Police Authority and will have added responsibility in other areas of the criminal justice system. The PCC will consult the public and draw up a policing plan, in conjunction with the Chief Constable, and then hold the police accountable for achieving that plan. They will also control the budget and decide on that part of council tax paid directly to the police. The Commissioner will not run the police ^ that is the job of the Chief Constable.

The Government are making this change to bring more democracy to policing ^ it is designed to give communities more say in how their policing services are delivered. There have been objections voiced to this idea, largely around cost and the potential politicising of the police. This is a significant change to the policing service you receive and pay for. Make sure you have your say and vote in this election.
