From the Rector,



This month I am writing my article on Ascension Day – May 14th, arguably the most neglected of all the major festivals in the Christian year. My childhood memory reminds me that then it was given much more focus. At my church primary school each Ascension Day we went to our Parish Church for a special school service – in fact it was the only time in the year that the whole school did go. It was a major undertaking because Church and school were well over a mile apart and we were ‘crocodiled’ there (nowadays such things are called a ‘walking bus’ I believe) for a most joyous occasion. Afterwards we all walked back, were given our mid-morning milk and had the rest of the day off! We certainly all enjoyed Ascension Day and looked forward to it enormously. To be honest I am sad that these days many Christians don’t particularly remember this festival and the evening service we always hold (this year at Wilby) is not usually well-attended.

So what is the significance of Ascension Day? It remembers the final time when Jesus was seen physically on Earth and He went back to heaven from where He sent the Holy Spirit (ten days later) to empower the little band He had left behind to carry out the work He had commissioned them to do. The coming of Jesus into the world was God’s great ‘rescue plan’ for people. We have a nasty habit of messing things up with alarming regularity, and every other tactic had failed to sort out the problem. This ‘rescue plan’ had two phases. Phase one was all about Jesus, God’s Son, becoming human to live here and ultimately to die at the hands of ordinary people like us, but to rise again, conquering death and making a way for us to be put right with God – problem finally solved. At the Ascension we are told that Jesus returned to His Father and **sat down** at His right hand side, His work completed. It’s important for us to know recognise that that work is completed – our God never leaves things half done and that’s what this day celebrates.

So what about ‘phase two’? That’s where we come in. Phase two is all about Christians passing on that message to other people and so spreading the word and growing God’s kingdom on Earth. He wants everyone to be on the inside, He rejects no-one, but sadly many choose to stay outside of the Kingdom and it’s down to us to work to bring them in. It’s certainly not that Christians are any better than anyone else – certainly not! We’ve never claimed that. What we do claim is to have found the answer to the age-old human problem of how to put things right that have gone hopelessly wrong. The word ‘hopelessly’ completely disappears when God is brought into the picture. As someone once said, the Christian work is all about one beggar telling another beggar where to find bread.

In the light of all that in the past few weeks we have all seen the heart-wrenching pictures of the devastation caused by two severe earthquakes in Nepal with their associated aftershocks. We feel it particularly in these villages because we have such wonderful close connections with Christians there through the work of Emmanuel Churches Association. As I write we are preparing to hold a special collection for their relief work as well as a hunger lunch at Ecton, but by the time this is published we should know the result of those. This is our response, our reaching out with God’s love, to people in another part of the world. It is so hard to know what to say about these natural disasters, but it is important not to blame God. I don’t believe He sends these things, but He does work in them, to bring good from them if we will trust Him. I guess, we can only cry out to Him, ‘Lord, have mercy’!

Minutes of the Full Council Meeting of the Parish Council of Ecton held in The Village Hall, High Street, Ecton on Tuesday 17th March 2015 at 7.30p.m.

PRESENT: Mr D Dicks, Mr T Moffett, Mrs J Jones, Mrs A Fernley and Mr R East

IN ATTENDANCE: Mrs S Wong – Clerk, Wellingborough Mayor - Councillor Jim Bass, 2 Local Residents and PCSO P Hurst arrived 8.05pm.

230/15 APOLOGIES: Apologies were received from Mrs M Mulvey, Mr P Godby and Mr B Brophy (other engagements) these were noted and accepted.

231/15 DECLARATION OF INTEREST – None declared.

232/15 TO APPROVE MINUTES OF THE FULL COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 20th JANUARY 2015

Minutes of the Full Council Meeting held on the 20th January as previously circulated were read, confirmed and signed as a correct record of account subject to two small amendments.

233/15 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

No matters arising.

234/15 TO RECEIVE A REPORT FROM POLICE REPRESENTATIVES

PCSO Paul Hurst reported there were a low number of crimes in February just 1 x Burglary Non Dwelling (Forced entry to garage) nothing stolen. Today at 3pm there was a reported distraction burglary at Franklins Close. The CID is currently dealing with this incident.

With reference the 7.5 Tonne Lorry Restriction in the village, Police representatives will be meeting with the Highways to discuss increasing signage on the Northampton and Wellingborough Roads. PCSO Paul Hurst has asked that residents take down the registration numbers and company details of any HGV Lorries that travel through the village and pass the details on to him.

Councillors reported that there was another incident of Lambs roaming loose on the highways again. The lambs are escaping through broken fencing at Cockings Field. The farmer is also responsible for vast quantities of mud and sheep pellets covering the road surface at West Street. PCSO Paul Hurst will call upon the farmer this week. Clerk to contact Fisher German the agents for the field and request the repair of the broken fences.

235/15 SHORT PRESENTATION – RECRUITMENT CAMPAIGN FOR SPECIAL CONSTABLES FROM EMMA BULLOCK

Emma Bullock not in attendance – Deferred to a later date

236/15 TO RECEIVE REPORTS FROM BOROUGH AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

Borough Councillor Jim Bass reported he had recently attended a meeting with Northampton Borough Council regarding the on-going rubbish dumping issues at Lower Ecton Lane. There has been a suggestion to mount Sherpa Cameras along Lower Ecton Lane to try and catch the perpetrators in action. These cameras can be temporarily fixed to a lamp post (out of normal reach) and can be removed and re-located to other areas where necessary. These cameras have high resolution recording, four are currently on order and maybe sited in the near future.

237/15 DISCUSS ANY UPDATES REGARDING THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN / LOCALISIM BILL

Councillor Jones reported that the Neighbourhood Plan is approximately 50% completed. Councillor Jones will arrange for a copy of the current draft to be circulated to the Parish Council. The Council are interested to find out, how long it is anticipated it will take to complete the first draft. The Council are mindful that the current volunteers have busy working lives which hinder the progression of the plan and are therefore keen to be able to assist the group with moving things along quicker. It was **resolved** the Clerk would contact Mr James Wilson (Consultant that worked on the Earls Barton Neighbourhood Plan) to enquire about his costs and services.

Local resident Ash Sandhu spoke of his concerns regarding the current Parish Boundary. The old Parish Boundary line included all of his property and land. The new Parish Boundary appears to cut cross his garden thus dividing his property. It was **resolved** the Clerk would enquire with the Planning Department why these changes have been implemented once these facts have been checked out the Parish Council will be able to discuss whether any action from the Council is required. (Since the meeting the Council have replied and confirmed that the Boundary is as it was prior to recent changes, it therefore does not divide Ash's garden)

238/15 VILLAGE SERVICES

A. UPDATE REPORT ON THE IMPROVEMENTS TO THE PLAYING FIELD AND FUND RAISING EVENTS

Another fund raising meeting is due to take place this week to discuss further fund raising ideas and possible grant applications as the Parish Council were not successful with their recent Mick George grant application. The next fund raising event will be an Easter Egg Hunt being held in the village on Easter Saturday.

It was reported that one of the cradle swings is missing a safety strap. Councillors resolved the cradle swing should be removed for safety reasons until a replacement strap is fitted. Councillor Dicks will action. Clerk to check when the next ROSPA inspection is due.

Borough Councillor Jim Bass will enquire if the £28,000 required to complete the refurbishment of the Playing Field play equipment can be funded by a Section 106 agreement from the Borough Council.

B. RECEIVE UPDATES AND DISCUSS ANY VILLAGE MAINTENANCE MATTERS

The new dog waste bin installed at the bottom of West Street has been a success. It appears 95% of dog walkers are using it. Clerk to inquire if Wellingborough Norse would empty another dog waste bin in the village along Barton Fields. If so it was **resolved** to purchase another bin.

C DISCUSS RENEWAL OF GRASS CUTTING CONTRACT WITH HAYESWOOD LANDSCAPES

The Clerk has received a new tender from Hayeswood Landscapes for the Grass Cutting of the village for 2015. Their prices have increased by £20 per cut. This is the first price increase for several years. It was **resolved** the Clerk would obtain alternative quotes for the grass cutting to establish if Hayeswood were offering a competitive price. If the alternative quotes were no cheaper than £200 per cut it was **resolved** the grass cutting contract would remain with Hayeswood Landscapes for another year.

D DISCUSS ONGOING RUBBISH DUMPING ISSUES AT LOWER ECTON LANE

This on-going issue is currently being looked at by Anglian Water and Northampton and Wellingborough Borough Councils with an action plan for clean ups and enforcement activities being actioned.

239/15 RECEIVE UPDATES AND DISCUSS ANY HIGHWAY MATTERS AND HIGHWAY AGENCY

Councillor Moffett recently walked around the village with Helen Howard and Ciaran Murphy from MGWSP Highways department to inspect the number of pot holes on the roads. A number of pot holes were temporarily patched prior to the walkabout and it is intended in the new financial year large patch resurfacing of the worst areas of the roads will be carried out.

240/15 RECEIVE UPDATE REPORT REGARDING SYWELL AERODROME

Borough Councillor Jim Bass reported that there will be a meeting in the week regarding Sywell Aerodrome. Wellingborough Borough Council will be asked if they are going to continue to allow Sywell Aerodrome to continue to run in breach of Planning Regulation conditions. A formal complaint regarding Sywell Aerodrome has now been made to the Aviation Ombudsman.

241/15 PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Application No. WP/15/00028/FUL – Erection of a chemical dosing unit and boundary fence at Ecton Pumping Station – Pump

House on land adjacent 8 Franklins Close – No observations or objections were raised.

Application No. NCC 15/00017/CCDFUL – Installation of single mobile classroom at Ecton Primary School. No observations or objections were raised.

242/15 OTHER PLANNING MATTERS AND THOSE NOT YET DETERMINED

Application No. WP/15/00122/LBC – Construction of a detached dwelling together with forming new access onto the high street –

Manor House – 56 High Street – Change of application status from standard to listed – no other changes to the application have been made. Since our last meeting when there were no objections to this application. There was a discussion about concerns raised by Councillor East about the length of the listed wall that would be removed for access. Councillor East reported that other residents had made similar representations and another resident had emailed Councillor Bresnahan. Councillor Bass was asked if the Council could influence the Highways advice about the access and he advised we could not. Whilst concerns were noted it was decided that no concerns would be raised about the application.

The consultation period on The Strategic Plan for the Borough of Wellingborough closed at 5pm on Monday 9th March 2015. The Parish Council submitted the comments drawn up by the Neighbourhood Planning Group. Information on the plan can be obtained from their Website www.wellingborough.gov.uk.

C. REVEIW YOUTH CLUB AND NEWSLETTER ACCOUNTS WITH A VIEW TO MAKING A GRANT DONATION

The Clerk was unable to obtain a copy of the Youth Club Financial Accounts or the Newsletter Accounts prior to the meeting. It was **resolved** to defer considering grant awards for the two groups until copies of their Accounts are received. It was **resolved** to make a grant award of £500 to Ecton Church to help with their maintenance costs of the Church.

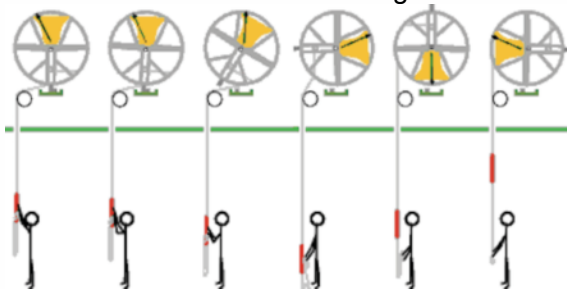

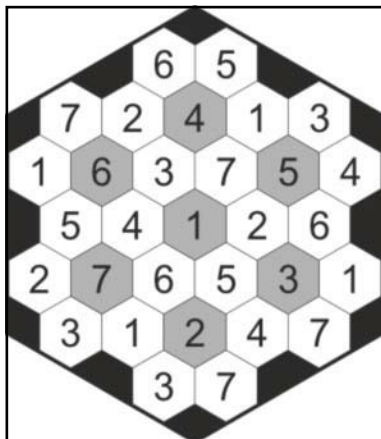

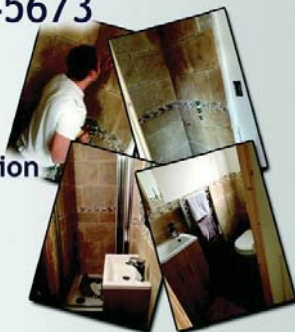
