From the Rectory



Over the past month we have seen potential big changes in our world. There has been the amazingly rapid spread of the new so-called 'Islamic State' which has been responsible for so much pain and atrocity in parts of the Middle East and I'm sure we were all shocked at the news of the recent murder by them of the British aid worker, David Haines. I was encouraged, though, to read of how much that group, large as it is, and growing fast, has been disowned and condemned by true Muslims of many nations. There was even a call to our Prime Minister to stop calling it 'Islamic State' because that appears to recognise and therefore legitimise something which, in their view, is neither truly Islamic, nor a State.

As I write this month we are also just approaching the referendum on Scottish independence, but of course, you will know the result by the time you read this. This is not the place for me to make political comments one way or the other, but on whichever side of the fence you happen to sit, I'm sure we are all aware of just what a huge decision it is. It changes the shape of our nation from what was established at the death of Elizabeth I in 1603 when James VI of Scotland became James I of England. That's a very long time. For most of the campaign the queen has, quite rightly in my view, refused to be drawn in to the debate, but it was reported last Sunday that she commented to someone as she went to Church at Sandringham, that the people of Scotland needed to think very carefully indeed before they vote. I'm sure we can all agree with that; the ramifications are huge. We live in momentous and changing times and I often think that in these kinds of situations we don't always realise just how significant they are until we look back afterwards. How shall we look back at this time, I wonder, in days to come?

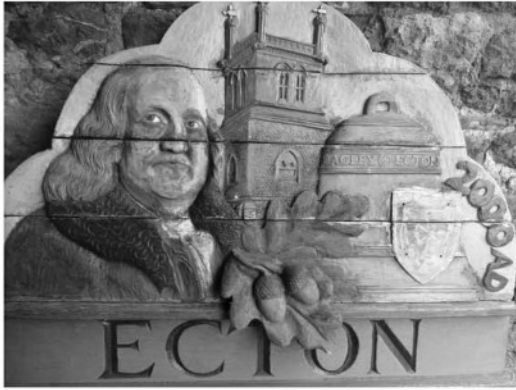
We are very much in the Harvest season now. Ecton and Great Doddington will held their celebrations towards the end of September and Wilby's are in October. It's always a wonderful time as we come together to give thanks for all the blessings that God showers upon us – and not just the flower, fruit, and vegetables which are the particular focus at this time of year. I look forward very much to being able to report next time on how the open air 'Songs of Praise' event at the Great Doddington allotments has gone. It's an exciting new venture and I pray that many people will come and join us there.

We are also just beginning new Confirmation classes. Although an introductory meeting is being held at the end of September, it's still not too late to join either the young people's or the adult preparation group. Bishop Donald will be with us on December 7th in the afternoon for a special service at Great Doddington when he will dedicate our new facilities, which should be all finished by then, and also to conduct the Confirmation.

I also need to flag up an event taking place next month, in November. Five years ago we held a very successful 'Vision Day' out of which sprang our five-year strategy document and annual action plan. It's time now to look again and plan for the next period. Our three villages Church communities are meeting together for a morning on Saturday November 8th in Ecton Village Hall, for just two and a half hours and once again we shall have our diocesan officer for Evangelism, Miles Baker, to help us. This is especially important this time as we seek to put in place robust arrangements to carry the three churches through a time of vacancy when I retire from here next summer. This morning conference is open to all so please put the date in your diaries now.

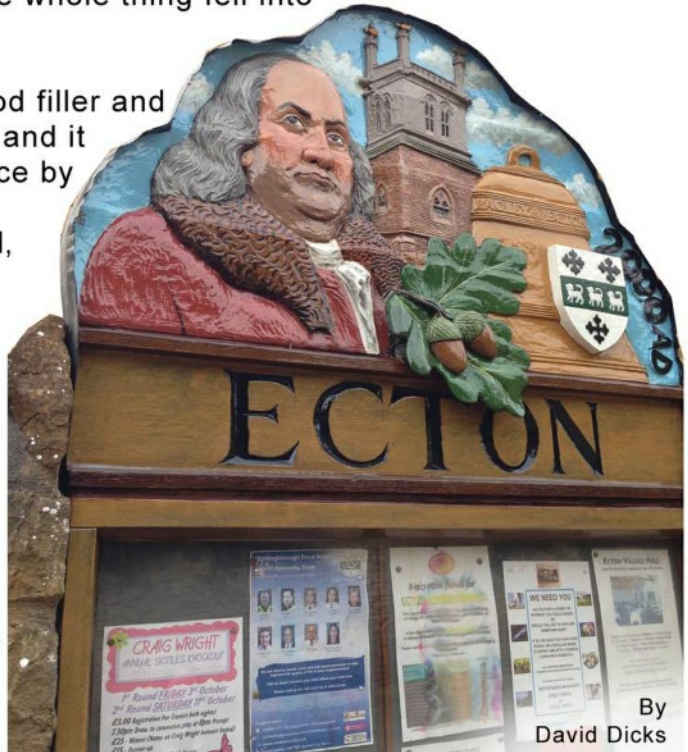

When I first removed the sign because it was starting to 'bend', I discovered that the wet had got into the back and joints and had caused quite a bit of rot. This had to be removed and allowed to dry for quite a time. Then the whole thing fell into 4 pieces !!

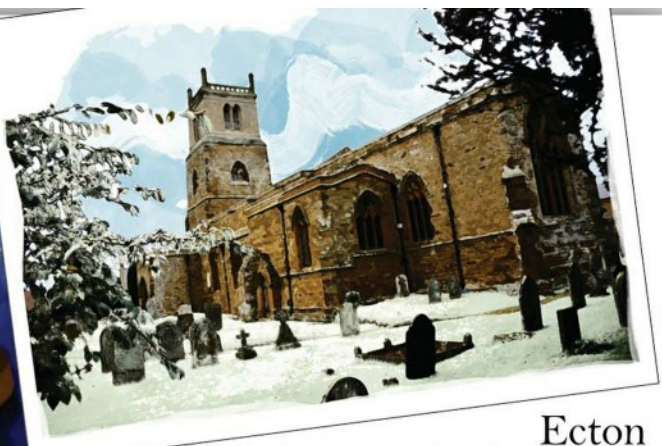
So large amounts of wood filler and rot treatment were used and it was then remounted piece by piece onto a thick new plywood backing, cramped, glued and screwed !!

Now it has been very kindly and expertly repainted by Adrian Teal, from the village, whose work was featured on the front cover of the September Magazine.

IN ATTENDANCE: 2 Parishioners, PCSO Paul Hurst and Mrs S Wong – Clerk. Apologies were received from Borough Councillor and the Mayor Mr J Bass (work meeting)

166/14 APOLOGIES: Apologies were received from Mr R East (work meeting), Mrs A Fernley (sick), and Mrs J Mulvey (holiday) These were noted and accepted.

167/14 DECLARATION OF INTEREST – None declared.

168/14 TO APPROVE MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON 20th MAY 2014

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on the 20th May 2014 as previously circulated, were read, confirmed and signed as correct records.

169/14 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

The annual litter pick of the village took place on Saturday 31st May 2014. Once again the Three Horseshoes Pub provided volunteers light refreshments and sandwiches at the end of the litter pick. Clerk has sent a letter of thanks to the landlord of the Three Horseshoes Pub.

170/14 TO RECEIVE A REPORT FROM POLICE REPRESENTATIVES

PCSO Hurst reported there was a theft of two pots of flowers at the Worlds End Pub and one road rage incident in the area. The Chair Mrs S Bresnahan reported to PCSO Hurst that a motor bike was stolen from her property. PCSO Hurst wasn't aware of this incident and would make some enquiries. Sheep had escaped from fields in the area recently causing a commotion on the highway, Police were called to help capture the sheep. The owner was cautioned and the offending fence has been repaired.

PCSO Hurst left the meeting at 7.40pm

171/14 TO RECEIVE REPORTS FROM BOROUGH AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

No Borough or County Councillors were in attendance.

The Council recently submitted an application for funding through the County Council's Empowerment Fund to be used towards the costs of replacing play equipment on the Playing Field. County Councillor Paul Bell has informed the Clerk our application has been successful and funds will be made available shortly. The award amount is yet to be confirmed.

172/14 DISCUSS ANY UPDATES REGARDING THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN / LOCALISIM BILL

Councillor Janet Jones circulated prior to the meeting a draft letter for registering the Councils intent to produce a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish. It was resolved to send this letter and a map of the Parish to Steven Wood, Head of Local Planning and Development at Wellingborough Borough Council

173/14 VILLAGE SERVICES

UPDATE REPORT ON THE IMPROVEMENTS TO THE PLAYING FIELD

The recent Party In the Park fund raising event has raised £938.67 to be used towards costs of replacing the play equipment in the Playing Field. Councillor Paul Godby an employee of Barclays asked Barclays to match fund this amount, the funds have been approved and should be available shortly. Local group The Witches have also donated £76 to the Playing Field Fund.

The Clerk recently approached local building developers Clayson Country Homes Ltd and Seagrave Developments Ltd regarding supporting the Council's fund raising efforts. Both companies have made £100 donations to the fund. Clerk to send a letter of thanks for their support.

John Harmon of Seagrave Developments commented in his letter that Seagrave Developments have received many letters and telephone calls of complaints regarding building works they are carrying out in the village. The Parish Council to write to Seagrave Developments to acknowledge this.

Phase 1 of replacing play equipment in the Playing Field has begun. An order has been placed with Playdale.

It was noted that one of the springers in the Playing Field appears to be loose and needs re-securing in place. Clerk to contact Reids Playground Maintenance to attend to the springer.

RECEIVE UPDATES AND DISCUSS ANY VILLAGE MAINTENANCE MATTERS

Previous highway issues reported by the Clerk through the Street Doctor reporting system has resulted in Pot Holes in the village being marked up for repair. A Proud metal sewer manhole outside 41 High Street is now being monitored by highways and repair work has started on the 4 damaged / loose Kerb Stones outside the Cottages at 27, 29, 31 and 40 High Street.

Overgrown vegetation opposite the Worlds End Pub and extending around the corner on to the A4500 is still outstanding – Clerk to continue to chase.

There is a dead tree opposite 20 Church View – Clerk to notify Ecton Estates. The tarmac outside the Village Hall needs replacing – Clerk to notify Ecton Estates.

There has been a number of complaints about rubbish dumping – Clerk to inform Mark Reneerkens at Wellingborough Norse.

174/14 RECEIVE UPDATES AND DISCUSS ANY HIGHWAY MATTERS AND HIGHWAY AGENCY

The Clerk has submitted a works request form to the Highways Agency for the Enhancement Gang to carry out in the village. Work requests range from cleaning of signs, cutting and clearing and strimming of overhanging hedges / vegetation and repairs to potholes. A date for the commencement of works is yet to be received.

Councillors have received numerous complaints regarding parking of contractor's vehicles who are working at 4 West Street. These vehicles are blocking off access, which is being made worse at peak times during the morning and afternoon school runs. Emergency vehicles would not be able to get through access if needed. Clerk to contact Robert Nash Developers highlighting the problems and suggest as a better alternative contractor's park their vehicles along the Northampton Road.

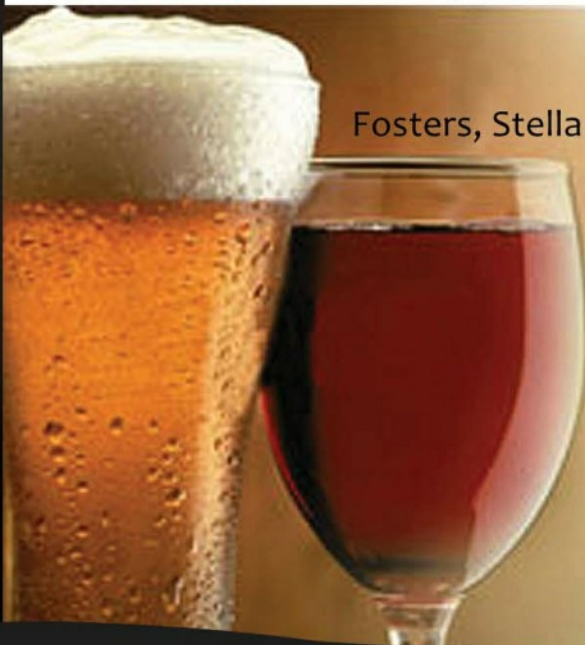
