ECTON PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The continual problem of helicopters flying over the village was again discussed at our September Meeting. A letter has been received from the Managing Director of Sywell Airport which stated that the village was outside their area of control, but they would inform pilots of our concern and hope that the situation would improve.

It was confirmed by the Rights of Way Officer that a kissing gate could be provided by the County Council provided that the Parish Council were responsible for the installation. This concerns the footpath at the bottom of West Street, and hopefully this will be completed in the near future.

Mr Needham reported that, following his inspection of the stone wall around the playing field and his discovery of a potentially dangerous hole in one side, small emergency repairs had been carried out satisfactorily.

Planning Matters

Listed Building consent granted to Mr & Mrs Anthony, 2 Church Way - new window in east elevation.

Application had been received from Mr Needham for new detached house on land adjoining The Grange. Mr Needham left the meeting when the item was discussed and, whilst there were no objections, the Parish Council decided that they would be represented at a site meeting with the Borough Planning Committee on September 26 at 10 am.

Street Lighting

Lamp no. 13 at top of West Street was reported as not working and Mrs Johnson confirmed that this had already been reported to EME.

Highway Matters

Complaints had been received regarding trees and shrubs which overhang the pavements in Northampton Road and Wellingborough Road from the World's End premises. Agreed to write asking for these to be cut back. Mrs Haycox raised her concern at cyclists who are still using the A4500 instead of the newly constructed cycle route at the side of the road. Agreed to write to the County Council regarding this matter and also question the position of new signs on this cycle route. A letter was received from Mrs Richards, 61 High Street, stating her concern over a raised stop-tap cover outside No 10 Wellingborough Road, and also the state of the pavements in various areas of the village. These matters would be pointed-out to the County Council, although in view of the impending undergrounding of television cables throughout the village it was thought unlikely that the general state of the pavements would be looked at until later.

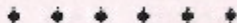

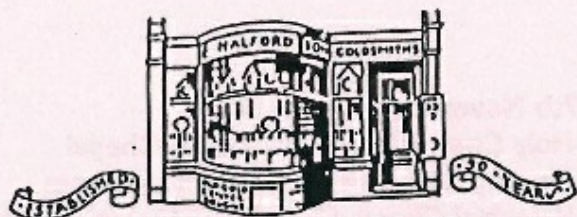
