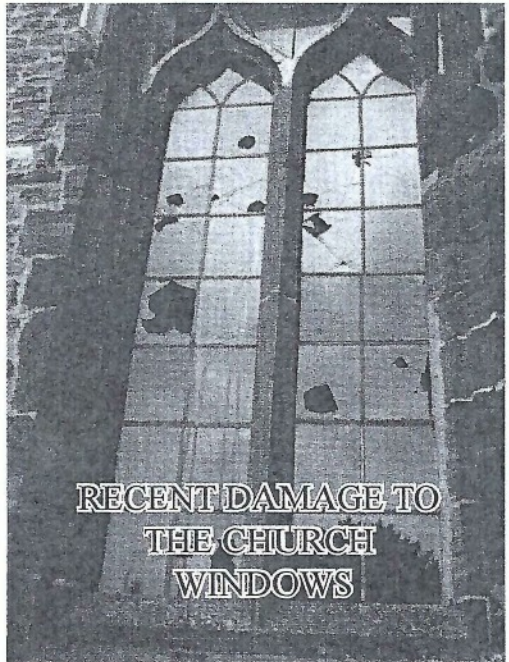

## THE COBBLERS

My family begged me to do a report about the cobblers so that's what I decided to do. Last season the cobblers ( Northampton town fc ) finished 9th; a great achievement for a club with so little money, and have only been in the Coca Cola League one for two seasons. This season ( 2008/09 ) we are in our third season in league one, hopefully we will have a chance of reaching the playoffs. But we have an extremely difficult league. Some of the difficult teams include: Leicester, Leeds United, Peterborough, Milton Keynes Dons, Carlisle, Southend, Scunthorpe and Colchester. Our first game of the season is against Cheltenham Town at home. That will be a game we should be able to win with such a strong squad. A crowd of 5,000 at least is expected at Sixfields. If we can fill our stadium for most of the games this season, we might be able to get improvements to our stadium and turn it into a 10,000 to 15,000 seater stadium. Our big derby match this season ( the biggest ) is against Peterborough United . As well as my dad and I getting a season ticket we will be going to a few away games. Also our second game which is away is against Mk Dons ( Milton Keynes Dons ) a crowd of 20,000 is likely to turn up, and 4-5,000 of them should be Cobblers fans  $\frac{1}{4}$  or  $\frac{1}{5}$  of the stadium crowd. The cobblers have some really good players like: Mark Bunn, Jason Crowe, Danny Jackman and Adebayo Akinfenwa. Plus loads more. We also made three signings for the new season they were: Leon Constantine, Liam Davis and Abdul Osman. These players should help the cobblers do well and improve our place in the league. Also we should do better in the FA cup, League cup and the Johnsons paint trophy. Last season in the league cup we were knocked out by Middlesbrough away 2-0, in the Johnsons paint trophy Brentford beat us 3-1 on penalties and in the FA cup we lost by two goals to one against Walsall. I hope we can win one of those cups. Our greatest chance is the Johnsons paint trophy because its only got league one and two teams in it . In the League cup we were really unlucky and in the FA cup-that was just shocking. Even though I was round at my friends house I persuaded him to let us listen to it on the radio -rubbish game -I was glad when it was over. This season I believe that our players are good enough to win anything but they need to put in 100 or more percent fitness and to work hard. Going up to the championship would be a great achievement for the club. I hope I will write in the Ecton village magazine again about the Cobblers.

FROM THE ECTON WEBSITE

Hi,

I have researched my Family History and believe that I am descended from both the Hensman and Jolley families in Ecton.

The Jolley ancestry has been relative easy to sort out. My ancestors would have been Edward Jolley who was buried on April 2, 1762 in Ecton and John Woodland who was buried on November 30, 1725 in Ecton. The Hensman family has proved a little more difficult. In order to find a direct line, several of us (Hensman descendants) have had to unravel a quite complicated family.

Two questions about the Hensman Family:-

1. Is there a list of publicans for 'The World's End'?
- We have Joseph Hensman buried in Ecton on May 28, 1704 - of World End. However, we're not sure who followed.
2. In the list of burials we have found a Mary Hensman buried April 20, 1769. There has been two interpretations of the comment by her burial.
    - a. 'Senoor Dame'
    - b. 'School Dame'

Can anyone shed light on this entry?

I'm one of several descendants who now live in Australia.

**47/08** MINUTES of the meeting held on 20th May 2008 as previously circulated, were read confirmed and signed as a correct record.

**48/08** MATTERS ARISING  
Lower Ecton Lane

Reported that fly tipping continues at Anglian Waters pumping station but is cleared on a regular basis.

The re-alignment of the entrance is still awaited

**49/08** SYWELL AERODROME

Members noted the contents of correspondence from Sywell Aerodrome regarding the number of aerobatic aircraft flying over Ecton whilst undertaking complicated manoeuvres.

Concern was also expressed that helicopters are still over flying the village.

Work has now started on the hard runway and should be completed by the end of September 2008

Mr. Bass advised that hopefully the Joint Consultative Council should be in place by early September 2008-08-06

**50/08** POLICE

Latest crime figures had not been received, Mr. Crabtree will circulate the figures issued to Neighbourhood Watch.

Problems with youngsters riding scooters through the village and at time outbreaks of fighting.

Mr. Stones reported that he had had two motor bikes stolen.

**51/08.** PLAYING FIELD

Wilby Trees had agreed to replace the recently removed walnut tree.

Clerk to liaise with Wilby Trees and the Youth Club regarding a time and date for planting

**52/08** STREET LIGHTS

Reported that the new light in Northampton Road had not worked since its installation. Clerk to pursue

**53/08** HIGHWAY MATTERS

Clerk advised that the County Council had advised that the sign at the entrance to West Street was in accordance with highway legislation with regard to it's size

Clerk agreed to take photographs of the sign and submit a suggestion to the County Council regarding a re-wording

Reported that the newly erected directional signs in Billing Lane and the A45 do not include Ecton.

Barriers on the A4500 between the Worlds End and bus shelter had been damaged  
 Ecton Lane and the A4500 footpaths were very overgrown making it extremely  
 difficult for pedestrians to negotiate

Clerk to report all three matters to the County Council for action

Clerk advised that the County Council had a number of VAS Signs that they  
 loaned to parishes for a short term

Period. Agreed to asking for Ecton to be included on the rota.

Agreed to ask the manager of the Worlds End Public House if they could request their cus-  
 tomers to stop parking on the A4500 as it creates a hazardous situation.

Mr. Bass reported that during a recent work experience day working on the refuse lorry he  
 had noted the high speed of traffic in the village and on the A4500.

Members advised that they had made a number of approaches to the County Council re-  
 garding introducing traffic calming measures, without success.

Agreed to obtain two quotes for verge mowing throughout the village.

**54/08 PLANNING**

Mr. Bass advised that he now sat on the Northampton Borough Council Scrutiny Commit-  
 tee with regard to the Anglian Water Treatment Plant.

Mr. Bass also advised that he had received a recent partition relating to odours from the site  
 which he will be presenting to and discussing with Northampton Borough Council. He did  
 express concern that one Councillor had stated that he did not consider there was a problem  
 with odours.

An odour monitoring system is to be installed by the end of August 2008.

WNDC has stated that the present site is cleaned up and odourless before any further devel-  
 opment if allowed.
