Rector's Letter May 2025



As we enter the month of May the spring flowers of the past couple of months are beginning to fade away, their welcome pastel colours being overtaken by the bright colours of summer. And those of us who grow vegetables will have been busy planting seeds, in the hope of some homegrown produce later in the year.

The Church has always been in tune with the seasons and so it is no surprise that May is the month in which we have Rogation Days. The word “rogation” is from the Latin *rogare*, which means “to ask” and on these days the Church has traditionally offered prayers for God’s blessings on the fruits of the earth and the labours of those who produce our food.

The Days of Rogation fall three days before Ascension Day, which this year is on Thursday 29th May. Ascension Day is the day Jesus returned to heaven after spending 40 days on earth, after the Resurrection and will be celebrated with a service of Holy Communion on **Thursday 29th May 7.30pm at Ecton Church**. Everyone is welcome to join us.

It is also this month that the Church holds its annual Thy Kingdom Come Event. This event started out as an invitation from the Archbishops’ of Canterbury and York in 2016 asking the Church of England to pray especially between Ascension Day and Pentecost (the day the Holy Spirit came). It is now an international and ecumenical call to prayer throughout the Church of England and other Churches.

This year our Benefice event is at Wilby Church on Saturday 31st May 10am – 12 noon.

There will be prayer stations around the church and an opportunity to spend time quietly engaging with various prayer activities. There will also be free booklets to aid daily prayer and suggestions of how to pray for others.

Maybe you have something you want to ask God for; something to thank Him for or maybe you would just like to come and spend some quiet time in the church. If so, do come along, you will be made most welcome.

The 8th May 2025, marks the historic 80th anniversary of VE Day, with the end of World War II in Europe.

On **Sunday 4th May 2025**, Ecton Village Hall will be joining peoples, families and communities of our great nation to unite and celebrate 80 years of peace and pay tribute to those who fought for the freedom we all enjoy today and act as a powerful reminder of the resilience and unity that have defined our country ever since.

All are welcome to join us at this memorable event. The event is **free** and we encourage you to **bring a picnic and dress up in 40's style clothing**. We will start the event by re-enacting what happened 80 years ago by **“Doing the Conga”** from the War Memorial down to the Village Hall. Once at the Hall you can look forward to being entertained with live 40's music from “Maggie May”. In addition there will be a bouncy castle, games, old fashioned sweets stall, a memorabilia display and the bar will also be open.

Please put up flags/bunting in your streets to celebrate the occasion.



How do I report speeding?

If you are concerned about speeding, you should contact your neighbourhood policing team first. You can also report driving offences online here [Report a road traffic incident | Northamptonshire Police](#).

Your PCSOs have received speed enforcement training and can use the speed guns if you report speeding concerns on a certain road/area. PCs have the power to stop and deal with vehicles at the roadside who can educate drivers or prosecute them with a ticket. PCSOs can give out warning letters to drivers caught and will then pass on their reports to the safer roads team.

You can access road safety information and data via our public access system [here](#). You can see our enforcement locations, the monthly number of offences throughout the county, and submissions and outcomes of Op Snap.

Op Snap

This scheme allows the public to submit dashcam evidence online regarding road offences within 14 days of the offence. The team **can only accept video footage**. They will then prosecute the driver with a notice of intended prosecution.

In February 2025, there were 154 submissions to Op Snap. You can submit your footage here [Northamptonshire Police Operation Snap](#).

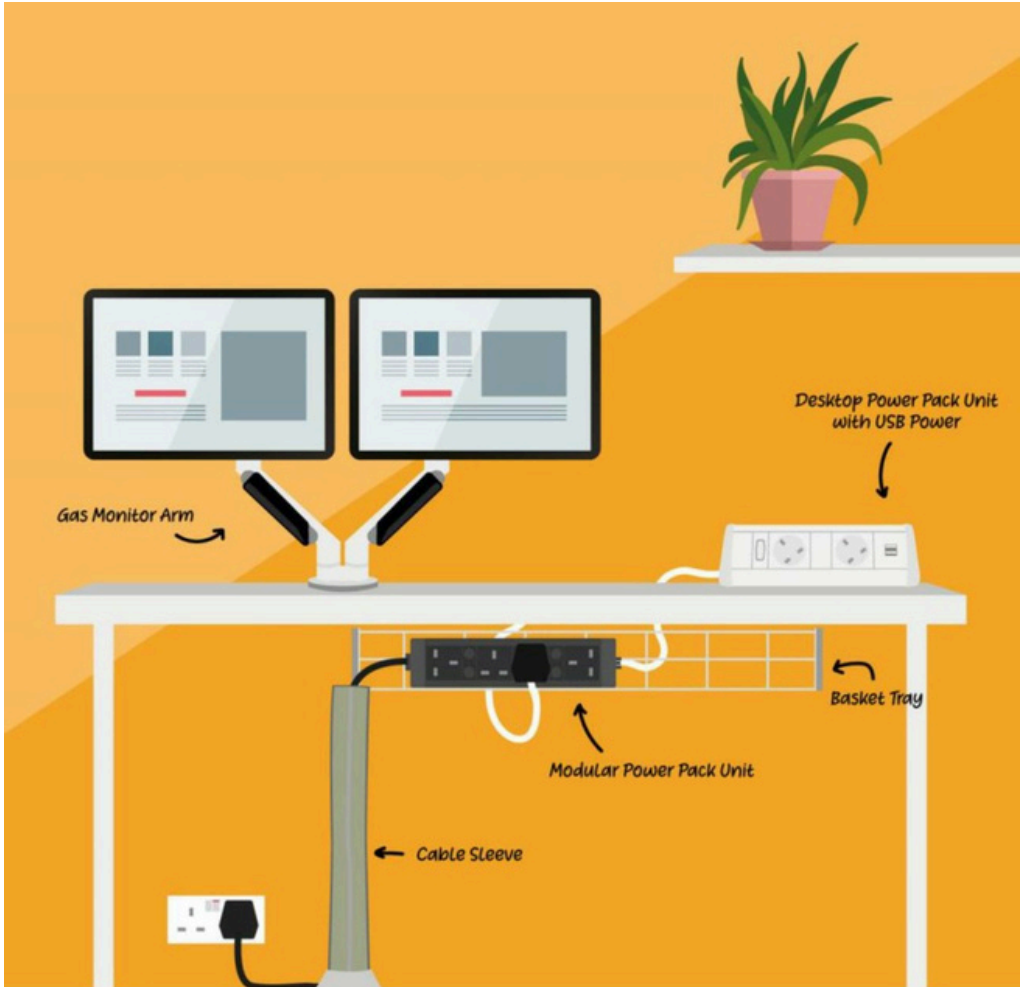

Ecton History

437 years ago on 18th May 1588, the Spanish Armada set sail towards England, after encountering violent storms, they returned to gather again and set sail on 12th July. In anticipation of this invasion a series of Beacons were placed at strategic high points from the south coast right up to York. There were 5 Beacons in Northamptonshire, one of which was on the top of Ecton Church tower. When the fleet was spotted off the Cornish Coast on 19th July the first beacon was lit, this started the chain of beacons, which passed the signal all the way up to York within just 12 hours. Battles ensued and by October all surviving ships were on their way back to Spain.

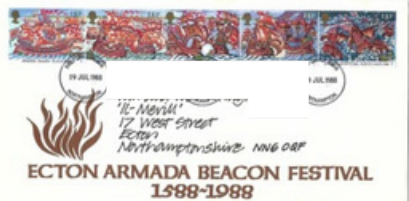
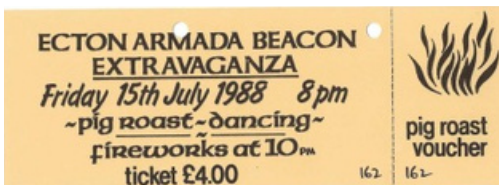
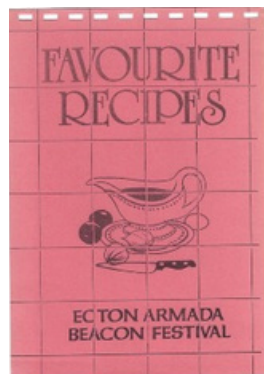
In July 1988, to commemorate 400 years since the Spanish Armada, Ecton held a Beacon Festival, some of our Ecton residents may remember it well.

There was an Elizabethan Banquet, Tea Towels and Goblets for sale, a book of Favourite Recipes, First Day Covers and a Pig Roast as well as other events over the weekend. 90% of the profits going, rather appropriately, to necessary repairs to the Church Tower.

Ecton certainly knows how to throw a party!

We at Ecton Parish Council, like fellow villagers are completely fed up with the regular occurrence of fly-tipping which occurs in Lower Ecton Lane.

To be honest, I can't remember a Parish Council meeting where this particular subject is not discussed!!

However, to let everyone know, we are always asking North & West Northants councils to come up with a solution, and you may have seen more councillors getting on board recently with our requests for something to be done, although I suspect elections in May might be behind some of this.

To be frank, I am surprised no one has been injured and hurt with the way the road is left at times, especially with logs and rubble being left on blind corners etc, so something definitely has to be done!

Recent developments have been the organisation of an inter-departmental meeting of various agencies so both councils North and West now talk to each other, with the parish, police/fire etc to discuss the problem and hopefully find a solution.

Early days at the moment to mention any outcomes, but we will be keeping the pressure on. For example to have those caught prosecuted, then named and shamed etc..

One change has been to Ecton Tip, which going to be open 7 days a week. Although I am sceptical that the planned closure at 4pm, and not the current 6pm, might mean more evening dumping? Guess we'll have to monitor and complain again, if this does occur. We're always happy to discuss problems and solutions from fellow residents, so please let us know what we're getting right/wrong.

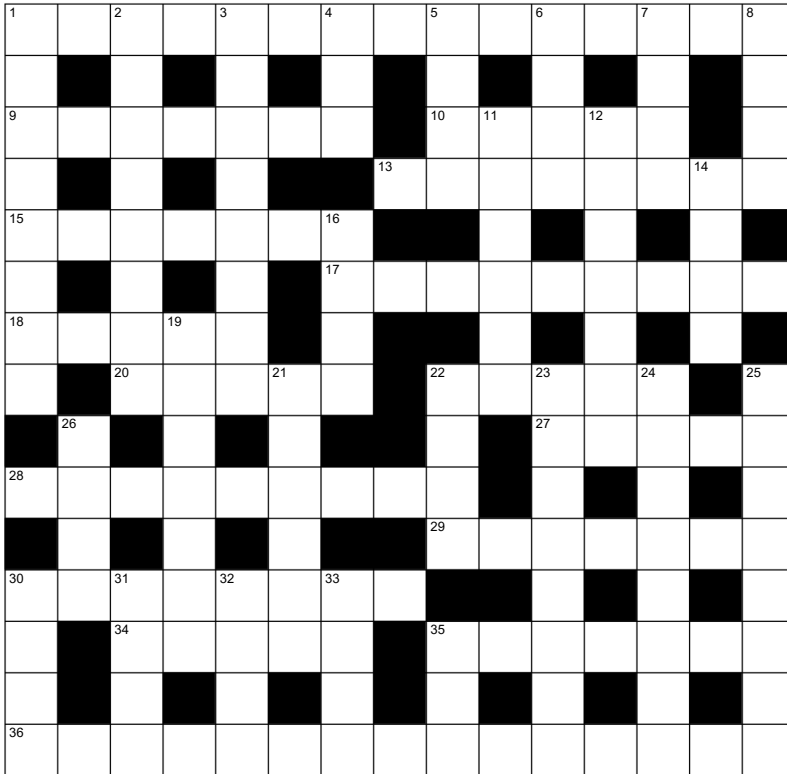

BE SCAM AWARE

Officers from Northamptonshire Police's Economic Crime Unit are warning the public about a group of rogue traders who have been attempting to scam vulnerable people in the county.

The national message is to Take Five to stop fraud. **STOP – CHALLENGE – PROTECT**

STOP – take a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information.

CHALLENGE – could it be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.

PROTECT – Contact your bank immediately if you think you've been scammed, either via online banking or by dialling **159** and when prompted asking for the fraud team of your bank. You should also report to **Action Fraud** on **0300 123 2040**.

Remember:

Most genuine companies will send a letter before they visit.

If you do open the door, put the chain on first.

Always ask for ID, close the door and check it with the company before letting them into your home (do not call the number given on the card, it may be fake). You may find the telephone number on one of your bills or the internet.

Genuine callers don't mind checks, they want to keep you safe.

If in doubt, DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR!
